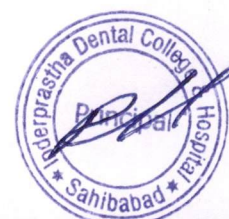

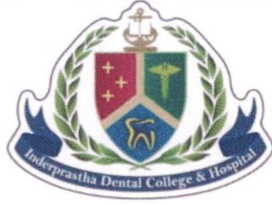
METHOD OF THE ASSESSMENT OF LEARNING OUTCOMES AND GRADUATE ATTRIBUTES

The learning outcomes of both BDS and MDS programs are defined by the affiliating university and the Institution takes the necessary steps for implementing the curriculum in order to achieve the learning outcomes. The information about the outcomes is communicated to the students.

- The institute conducts three internal assessment examinations in a given academic year to prepare students for better performance in final examination.
- Thereafter, the students are allowed to view their answer sheets, question paper is discussed with them and they are given feedback on how to improve their performance.
- End posting viva in theory and clinical skills is conducted at the end of the posting.
- The students are given feedback based on their performance in the test to help them assess the knowledge and skills acquired during the posting.
- At post graduate level mock examinations are conducted prior to both their 1st year end examination as well as for the final year end examination. The final year mock examination includes a practical, a pedagogue, thesis presentation and a viva voce component and is conducted by both internal and external examiners.
- The institute follows UGC 10 point grading system with the following letter grades as recommend by Dental Council of India (BDS Program Regulations 2022)
